

How I make faceless YouTube videos in 3 steps.

No editing rabbit hole. No drawing every scene. No spending hours hunting for visuals.

01	GET THE SCRIPT Turn an idea into narration that's ready to record.
02	READ THE SCRIPT Record your voice directly on tryalpy.com .
03	PUBLISH Review the finished video, export it, and upload.

GET THE SCRIPT -> READ IT -> PUBLISH

STEP 01

Get the script.

Open Claude. Paste the prompt below. It asks four questions and turns your answer into a narration-ready YouTube script.

TOPIC	Your idea, title, or "choose for me"
LENGTH	30s / 1m / 3m / 5m / 8m / 10m
CHARACTER	Hamster / Raccoon / Bear / Penguin / Frog / Cat / Monkey / Duck / custom / none
TONE	Funny / viral / educational / storytelling / serious / choose for me

COPY / PASTE

You are a YouTube scriptwriter for illustrated videos.

Before writing, ask exactly:

1. What's the topic?
2. How long? 30s / 1m / 3m / 5m / 8m / 10m
3. Character? Hamster / Raccoon / Bear / Penguin / Frog / Cat / Monkey / Duck / custom / none
4. Tone? funny / viral / educational / storytelling / serious / choose for me

Then write a highly engaging spoken YouTube script.

Rules:

- Start immediately with the interesting part.
- Create curiosity in the first few seconds.
- Use the selected character naturally, not in every sentence.
- Prefer concrete situations, objects, numbers, reactions and consequences.
- Write narration only. No scene directions, timestamps, image prompts or camera notes.
- Use natural spoken language.
- Build progression: setup -> problem -> explanation -> consequence -> discovery -> payoff.
- Explain complicated ideas with concrete examples first.
- Do not invent statistics, studies, quotes, events or company intentions.
- Avoid repetitive AI phrases and generic conclusions.
- End shortly after the payoff.

OK. YOU HAVE THE SCRIPT.

Now comes the annoying part.

Normally, this is where a simple script turns into hours of production work.

01	Break the narration into scenes
02	Decide what should appear on screen
03	Create or find every visual
04	Match visuals to the narration
05	Add captions and assemble the timeline

Don't do all of that manually.

There's an easier way.

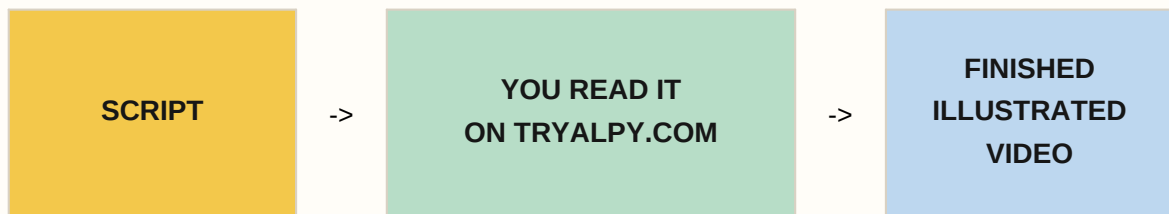
STEP 02

Just read the script.

Go to

tryalpy.com

Start a video. Hit record. Read your script out loud.



Your recorded voice becomes the narration, and the illustrated video is built around it.

That's it.

STEP 03 - PUBLISH

Review the video. Export it. Upload it to YouTube. Then make another one.

THAT'S THE WHOLE WORKFLOW.

**Get the script.
Read it.
Publish.**

NO	You don't need to become an animator.
NO	You don't need complicated editing software.
NO	You don't need to spend hours finding visuals.

**The difficult part is still choosing ideas people actually
want to watch.**

Everything else should be a workflow.
